For high school students:

July 17-24: **Latin Immersion Summer Program**, at Christendom College, near Washington DC. One-week intensive immersion Latin program with summer-camp atmosphere, for rising Juniors and Seniors in high school. <http://www.christendom.edu/latin/>

Program for beginners or near-beginners in Latin language:

Academia “Vivarium Novum”: October 2011-June 2012, Latin immersion college year/semester in Rome; no tuition charged to student; application deadline June 30, 2011; for young men only, due to location of school in religious foundation building (with swimming pool and basketball court!).

Admission: “Pupils from sixteen to twenty-five years of age, already in possession of the fundamentals of Latin grammar and a solid foundation of vocabulary, are admitted to the Academy. Room, board and classes are all completely free, sustained through scholarships from the Mnemosyne foundation.”

Courses: “The following are the base disciplines:

- Ancient Latin Literature
- Neo-Latin Literature
- Latin Composition
- Greek Language
- History of Ancient Philosophy
- Greek and Roman History
- History of Ancient Art”

All courses except Greek language are taught in Latin. It seems that one should have at least two years of college Latin.
